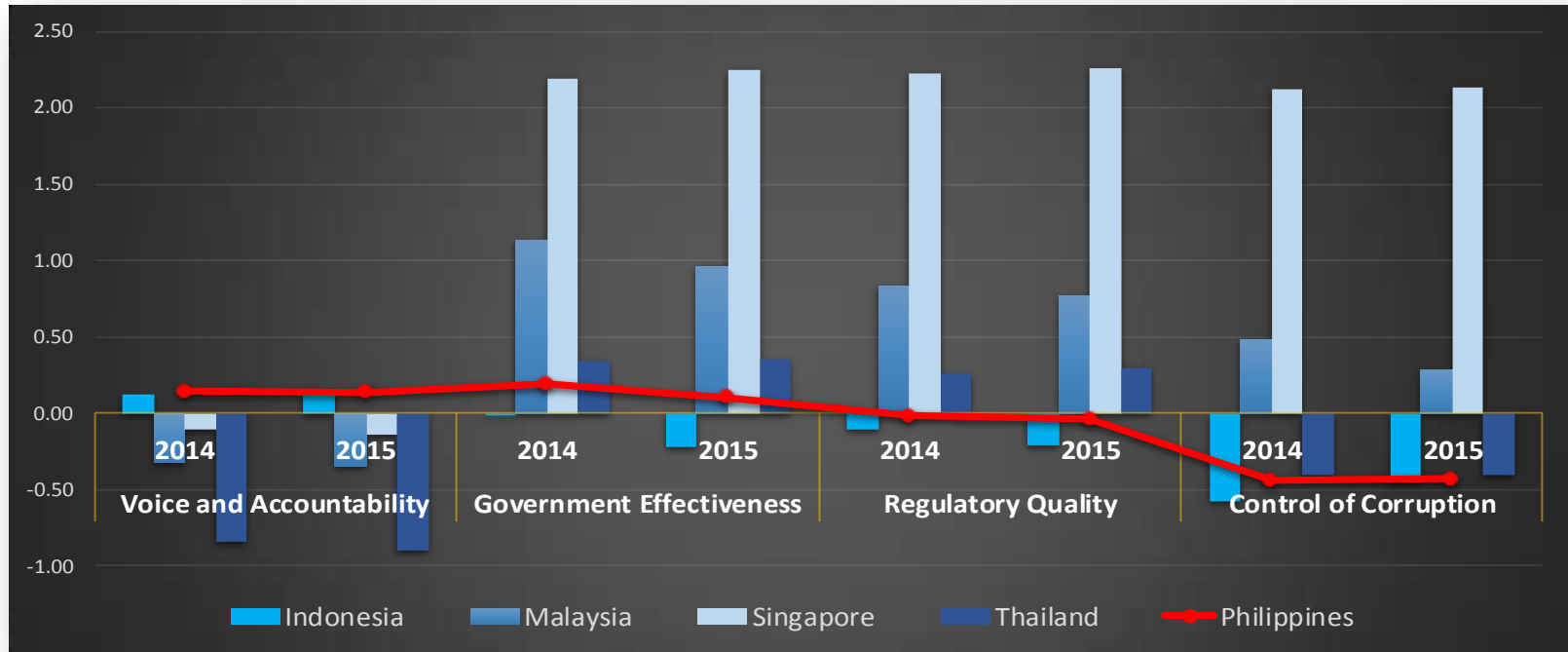


Vision of Filipinos for the Country

The Philippines' Performance in the World Governance Indicators (WGI)

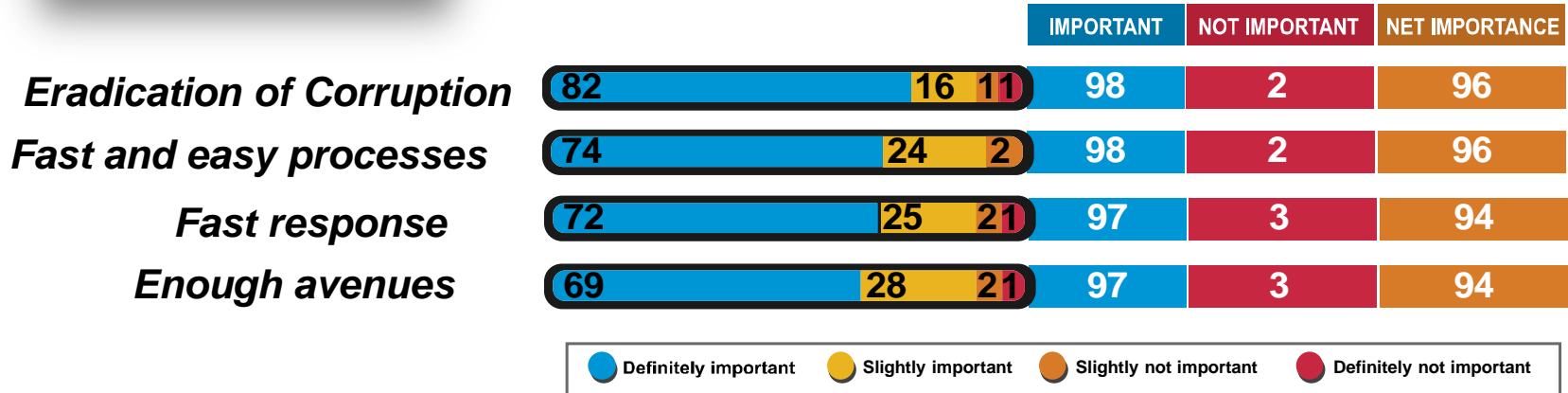


Estimate: -2.5 (weak) to 2.5 (strong) governance performance

National Survey on the Aspirations of Filipino People



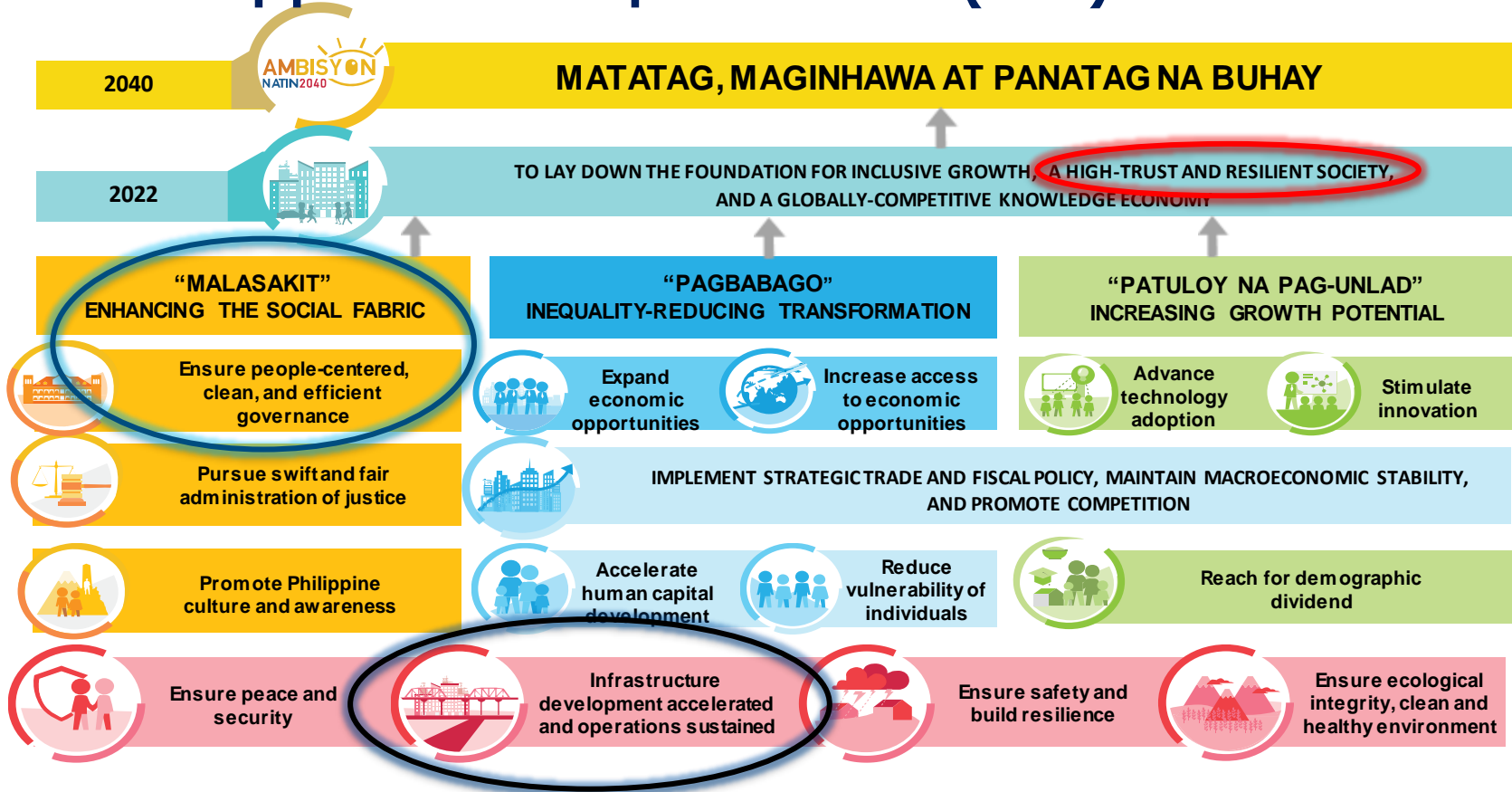
- **Interview Method:** Face-to-face personal interviews using tablets

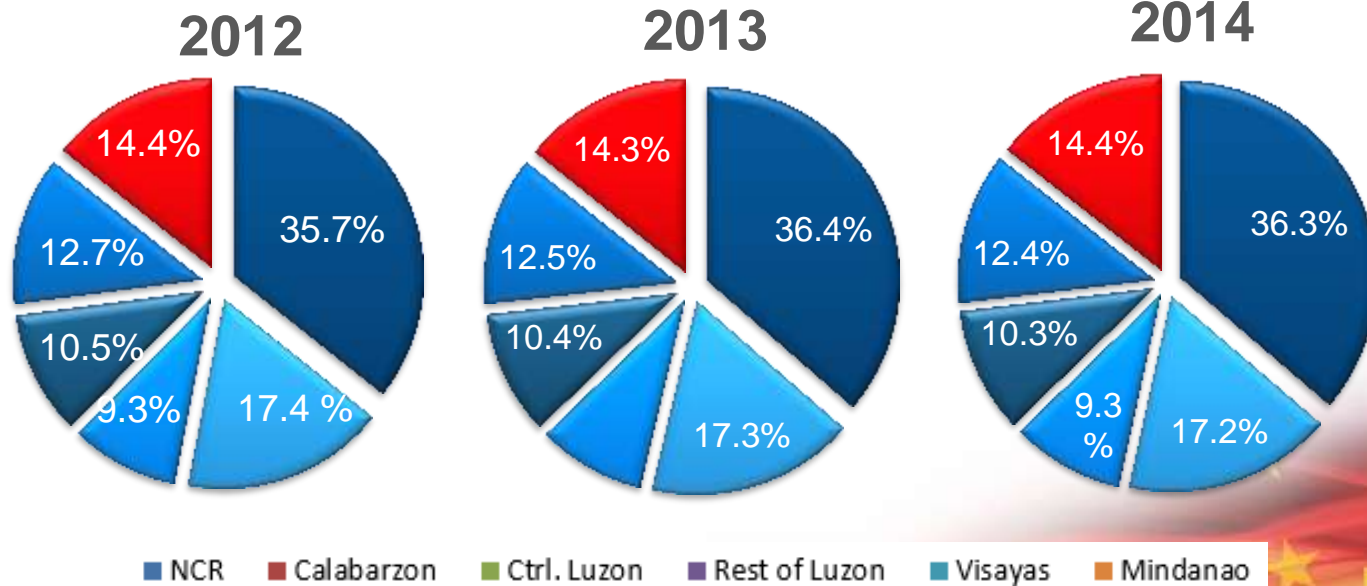

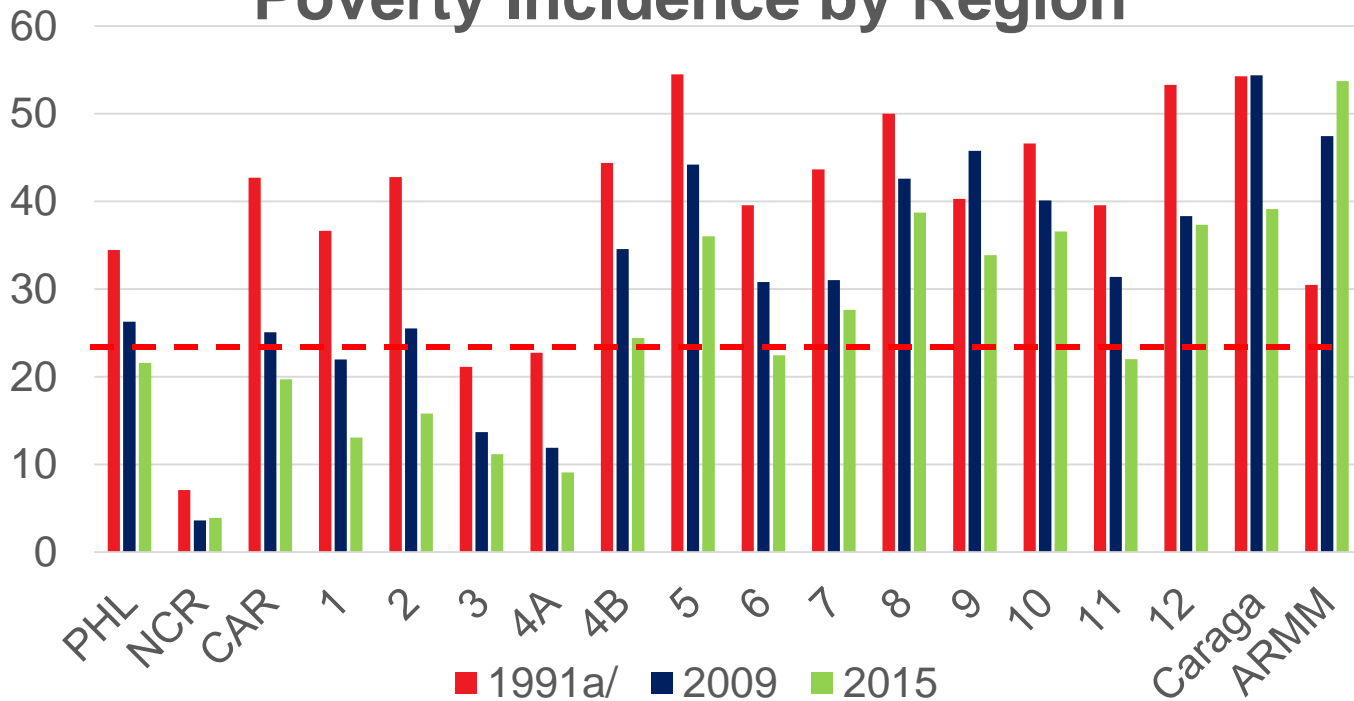
Gross Regional Domestic Product, 2012 to 2014 (at constant 2000 prices)

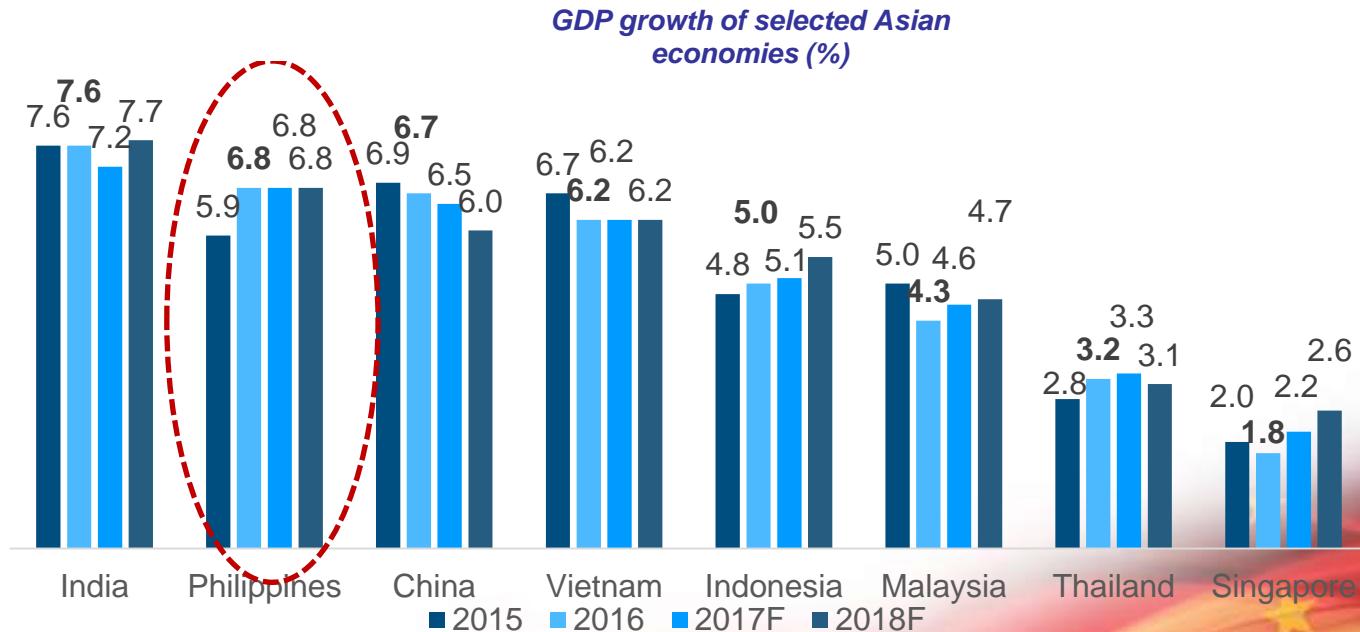
The reduction in poverty is fairly broad-based, even as regional disparity is still observed.

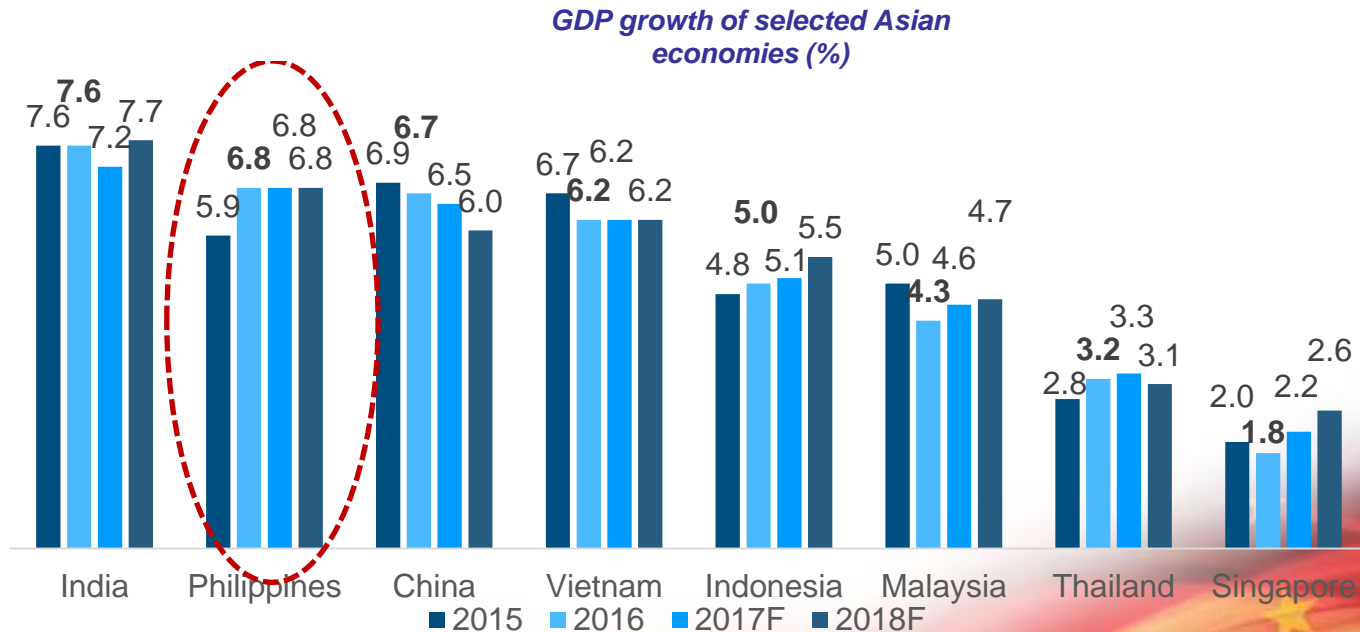

THE PHILIPPINES BY 2022



The Philippines will be an upper middle income country. The **GDP growth is expected to strengthen further to 7-8%**. Per capita income will increase from USD 3,550 in 2015 to at least USD 5,000 in 2022.



Overall poverty rate will decline from 21.6% to 14.0% in 2022 – equivalent to lifting about 6 million Filipinos out of poverty.



The unemployment rate will decline from the current 5.5% to 3-5%.

The vision of building a high-trust society for the Philippines is founded in the current development Plan, supported with bedrock strategies on accelerating infrastructure development



Infrastructure can be a prime element, yet not a panacea, in developing an ecosystem of participative governance.
